



Governor Arnold Schwarzenegger, who promised "I'll be back" at the Knott Studios groundbreaking in October, 2004, kept his promise when he returned to the Premiere.

Prior to the evening, the Governor joined students to film a segment for a video for the event that found him teaching a class about the importance of marketing. Schwarzenegger mentioned one exception to his rule about the importance of marketing, citing a sequel as one instance where an audience is often built in for a film.

He then revealed a poster of himself and Jim Doti in *Twins 2*, following up on a joke he and the President shared at the groundbreaking about casting Doti in the Danny DeVito role in the sequel to *Twins*.

At the end of the video, Doti and Schwarzenegger appeared on stage in matching outfits, including sunglasses and crutches (as the Governor continues on his crutches following a skiing accident).

Doti then presented the Governor with the first star on the Dodge College Walk of Fame.
